To merge multiple cells in Google Sheets, follow these steps:

1. Select the cells that you want to merge
2. Right-click on one of the selected cells
3. Click on "Merge cells" from the drop-down menu
4. The selected cells will now be merged into one cell, with the data from the top-left cell being retained
5. You can also use the shortcut key "Ctrl + Alt + M" to merge cells

## CONCAT

Returns the concatenation of two values. Equivalent to the `&` operator.

### Sample Usage

```
CONCAT("de", "mystify")
```

```
CONCAT(17, 76)
```

### Syntax

```
CONCAT(value1, value2)
```

`value1` - The value to which `value2` will be appended.

`value2` - The value to append to `value1`.

### Notes

`value1` and `value2` can be any scalar value or reference to a scalar value, including numeric and text types.

### Examples
