ISEMAIL

This function checks if a value is a valid email address against certain 2-letter country or region codes and top-level domains including:

Generic top-level domains

.com.org.net.edu.gov.info.biz.name.pro

Sponsored top-level domains

.aero.asia.cat.coop.edu.gov.int.jobs.mil.museum.post.tel.travel.xxx

This list doesn't include all top-level domains.

If an email is flagged as "False," it may use a top-level domain that isn't on our list.

Sample Usage

```
ISEMAIL("noreply@google.com")
```

```
ISEMAIL("johndoe@yourname.com")
```

Syntax

```
ISEMAIL(value)
```

`value` - The value to be verified as an email address.

ISURL: Checks whether a value is a valid URL.

ISERROR: Checks whether a value is an error.

ISTEXT: Checks whether a value is text.

ISBLANK: Checks whether the referenced cell is empty.
