To change a value to FALSE in Google Sheets, follow these steps:

1. Open your Google Sheets document and navigate to the cell containing the value you want to change.
2. Double-click on the cell to enter edit mode.
3. Type "FALSE" (without the quotation marks) in the cell and press Enter.
4. The value will now be changed to FALSE in that cell.
5. Alternatively, you can also use the formula "=FALSE()" in the cell to achieve the same result.
6. Repeat this process for any other cells that you want to change to FALSE.
7. Your changes will be automatically saved in the document.

FALSE

Returns the logical value `FALSE`.

Sample Usage

```
FALSE ( )
```

Syntax

```
FALSE ( )
```

Notes

In most cases, Google Sheets will automatically convert the `FALSE` literal to the logical `FALSE` value, equivalent to this function.

See Also

`TRUE`: Returns the logical value `TRUE`.

`NOT`: Returns the opposite of a logical value - `NOT(TRUE)` returns `FALSE`; `NOT(FALSE)` returns `TRUE`.

Examples

Returns the logical value `FALSE`.
