Next, include the title of the tutorial in italics, followed by the date it was published or last updated. If available, include the URL or DOI of the tutorial. Finally, add the date you accessed the tutorial and any relevant page numbers or time stamps. This citation format ensures proper credit is given to the original source and allows readers to easily locate the tutorial for further reference.

Citation Information

If you would like to cite any of the software tutorials, you may use the following information.

Author: Kent State University Libraries **Date:** Use the page's "Last Modified" date (right-click anywhere on the page, then click View Page Info; use the DC.Last.Modified date) **Title:** Use the guide name and the tutorial name; e.g., *SPSS Tutorials: Pearson Correlation* or *SAS Tutorials: Pearson Correlation*
